Hello All,

Membership renewal period is over, with a current total of 72 members. As of Oct. 1, only paid members will be allowed to play and enjoy all other club activities including our newsletters. If you don't remember whether you paid or not, contact Allan Gallera.

The new play rules addressing waiting time on crowded courts, along with the current calendar are now posted on the website. The budget was also approved. Interested members can contact Ishwar Chander to get a copy.

The Friday night tournaments are underway. Each night the play format may change depending on the number of players showing up. Please be on time. If you arrive late, you may not be able to be accommodated due to the play format in effect for that night. The Board is considering providing Pizza for at least 8 players, on a first come, first serve basis. This hasn't started as of Oct. 7, but may start soon. Contact Ishwar to let him know if you plan to attend each Friday night.

You may have noticed that Magnolia Park has been mowed and blowed on Wednesdays during play. The Parks and Recreation department has been notified and hope to rearrange the mowing schedule. It may take a couple of weeks to fix. Please be patient.

I hope my reminder last month about the ticketing on Mondays hasn't restrained you from playing. Usually you can beat the street sweeper if you park after 9:00am. Sweep marks alongside the curb is usually a sign that it has passed. Afterwards there is plenty of time to get a lot of tennis in. However, still keep an eye out to make sure the sweeper didn't start late. If you see it coming toward where you parked, grab your key and move.

As noted in the Oct. Board mtg. minutes, included in this newsletter, the Board is looking into ways of attracting younger, more competitive members. If we are successful, we should be able to revive our getaways, inter-club tournaments, and ladders. Some thoughts being considered are included in the meeting minutes. Hopefully we will attract members who are able and will volunteer for the board and chair positions in future years.

The Acers have started their season. Next Monday evening they will be hosting the tournament at our courts at Magnolia Tree Park, 6:30PM. Hopefully, the lights will be on. I've asked the city to start lighting earlier because it is dark at least ½ an hour before the lights turn on. Hopefully I'll know before this week is out. Meeting: October 7, 2016

Meeting called to order at 10:40am.

The Board approved the September Minutes.

BOARD REPORTS

President: The Calendar and play rules are now posted on the web-site. Neil asked the city if they could change the grass cutting from Wednesdays back to Tuesday's again. In the next 2 weeks there should be a change. Neil will remind the members that on Mondays there will be no parking tickets from the police if we park by the courts once the street cleaning is done. Members can also park across Walnut St. and play earlier.

Neil is working with Roy to get all club pertinent information to update the web-site.

Budget/Membership: As of September we have 71 members.

Our balance is \$3,575. The approved budget is available to members if requested.

Tournament Director: Friday evening tennis has started.

CHAIRPERSONS

Social events: Nancy and Sallie will check cost and dates for the Christmas Party.

Neil thanked Nancy for a good job for the Board and Chairpersons' appreciation luncheon.

Photographer: Tom will continue to gather photos of members for placement in the Newsletter, website or on the bulletin board.

Club Equipment: Bernie will check our equipment and estimate the value. These are assets of the TTC and their current value will be carried in the budget. An amount to either fix or replace these assets will be added to the Reserve line item.

OLD BUSINESS

There was no old business.

NEW BUSINESS

Bernie has some Club cards that can be used for one free tennis day of play with the club. The cards are placed by the entrances to courts 1 and 2. If the courts are very busy, guests will stop play at the end of their match and relinquish the court to members.

Our organization is getting older and less involved. As a result, Neil would like some suggestions on how to attract younger more competitive and active players to join the club. One suggestion was a 'Meet-Up" like tennis on a Saturday afternoon when the club has reserved, but unused time, on the courts. Individuals would have to be a level 3.0-4.0 players. They would be required to join the club for our \$25 annual membership fee. They could also join with the family memberships fees as well. We are also looking into expanding our family memberships to attract families with older dependents to participate in our events. This discussion will be part of our OLD BUSINESS discussions at the next board meeting.

Board Meeting times: Changing the time of the current board meetings to not overlap with tennis plan on MWF was discussed. It was decided that we should keep the same time on Friday at 10:30am.

Friday Evening Tennis: It was suggested that we have food along with the tennis. This might encourage more members to come play and socialize.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:40am.

The next meeting will be 10:30am, Friday, November 6, at Chris' house.

How to Hit The Perfect Lob

There are different types of lobs: offensive, defensive, underspin, topspin, good, bad, in & out.

You must first master the underspin lob that you can do at any time, whether you are on the run, or in a balanced position.



This is done with a continental grip. The backswing is much smaller than a regular groundstroke, the main ingredient in this shot is that you must hit the "bottom" of the ball, not the back of the ball. Therefore, you may have to bend your knees a little more to help hitting the "bottom, or underneath" of the ball. Your wrist and elbow stay fairly straight as you lift under the

ball toward to the sky.



Think of your arm as an elevator starting at the bottom floor, and going up to the 7th floor. You do not need any other follow-through on this shot. People miss this long, because they try to follow through over their shoulder, or they miss short because they did not contact the ball in front of their body.



The contact point for the forehand or the backhand is exactly the same as the ground strokes, but less backswing, and less follow through. The follow through is where the racquet strings should be facing the sky when you're done with the shot. Master this shot, and frustrate your opponents to death!
